WHAT IS SNAP E&T (EMPLOYMENT + TRAINING?)

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) formerly known as food stamps is a nutrition program that helps low income individuals and families buy food and stay healthy.

SNAP Employment and Training prepares SNAP clients for employment by offering vocational training, career activities, case management, and support services.

SNAP uses a holistic approach to help students succeed in our programs. We provide counseling, vocational training, and employment activities in order to increase the opportunity students have of finding employment.

AM I ELIGIBLE FOR A SNAP SCHOLARSHIP?

- You must be receiving SNAP benefits.
- Students receiving TFA (cash assistance) are not eligible for SNAP training.
- You must have a GED or high school diploma.
- SNAP clients cannot participate in training programs in which they cannot be employed by law.
- Students that have a **“HOLD”** because they owe the college money not be allowed to register for SNAP Training.
